Use of Sports Premium in 2017/2018

The government is providing additional funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary school head teachers. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

This means that the premium should be used to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities that school already offers
- Make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Funding can be used to:

- Hire qualified sport coaches to work with teachers
- Provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- Introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- Support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports club, holiday clubs
- Run sport competitions
- Increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- Run sport activities with other schools

Sports Premium funding objectives:

1. To improve the quality of existing PE teaching through continuing professional learning in PE for generalist so that all primary pupils improve their health , skills and physical literacy and have broader exposure to a range of sports.
2. To increase participation levels in competitive sport and healthy activity of pupils and maintain these into adolescence
3. To increase the quality of initial training in PE and sport, and to promote PE specialism in primary level workforce
4. Schools understand and value the benefits of high quality PE and sports, including its use as a tool for whole school improvement

Measuring the impact of Sports Premium Spending

PE subject coordinator, SLT and coaches from Premier Sport work together to provide support and monitor impact for the pupils in PE. Activities and provision are carefully planned for and evaluated by these staff, who monitor the impact on the pupils in a variety of ways.

- Evidence arising from learning walks
- Pupil voice
- Discussions about teaching and learning with teachers and coaches
- The views of staff

- **Hiring specialist PE coaches** to work with ALL teaching staff when teaching PE from Nursery to Year 6 to increase the % of children working above age expectations
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for **professional development** in PE and sport
- Entering **sport competitions** - inter-house and Intra with A,B and C, thus increasing % of pupils' participation in competitions
- Buying **quality assured professional development** modules or materials for PE and sport.
- Purchase new **PE equipment for sustainability**
- Providing places for pupils on **after school sports cubs and holiday club**. Focusing on the less active pupils
- Increase children's **active lifestyle** during lunchtime with a range of sports/activities x3 week focusing on the less active
